We extend our work beyond the walls to foster deep community partnerships and provide supportive health services that address social determinants of health in our community and to address disparities and social determinants of health.





2024 Highlights



Maternal/Infant Health Education Symposium

At Mom Civic center, airport road, Warri, Delta state, on March 22nd, we hosted an education symposium for the sole purpose of educating women about the state of maternal and child health, stigma and myth surrounding childbirth in Nigeria. During the event, we addressed a lot of stigmas and misconceptions around cesarean section birth, males involvement in pregnancy, exclusive breastfeeding, family planning, and postpartum depression.

During the event, we distributed free items which includes 108 infant formula (NAN), 72 baby food (My boy), 10 baby beds/cribs, 150 pampers (pack of 34), 20 baby carriers, 300 sanitary pads (pack of 24) and 15 BP machines.















Adolescent Health Event











On the 16th of March, we conducted an adolescent health event in Okerenkoko. During the event, 40 adolescents were educated on growth, development and menstrual hygiene.

On July 2nd and 3rd, 2024, MICN hosted its inaugural West Africa Adolescent Health Awareness event in Benin and Togo, drawing an audience of 144 adolescents. The event made a meaningful impact, particularly on adolescent girls and women, as we provided crucial education on topics like reproductive health, menstrual hygiene, and STD prevention. We distributed 144 sanitary pads to the girls present, supporting their health and well-being.







Medical Care Event













On 28th of March, we hosted a medical care event in Opuweidebubor, where we recorded 206 attendants. Free vital signs check was carried out and we discovered 26 patients had high blood pressure. We also gave free dental care to the participants.







On March 16th, we hosted a medical care event in Okerenkoko town, Delta State which had 800 attendees. During the course of this event, 112 people had eye checkups (including children, men and women). 32 patients registered for possible cataract extraction. 115 patients received dental checkups and 6 patients had their tooth removed while several others got theirs cleaned. We also discovered 20 patients who were hypertensive and 30 children who had measles. Some under five children were found to be malnourished and others have had no immunization at all which means they have never been vaccinated. This calls sensitization on health related issues like family planning, immunizations and nutrition.

Breast Cancer Awareness Event





health education program at Ekpan
General Hospital in Warri, Delta State. The
event aimed to raise awareness about
breast cancer, promote early detection,
and raise funds for breast cancer research
and support services across Nigeria. The
program included health education
seminars, breast self-examination
workshops, and the provision of
healthcare services such as blood
pressure screenings, BMI assessments,
tuberculosis testing and family planning
services. Additionally, we facilitated
medical consultations for 146 women,
addressing a range of health concerns.

During the Breast Cancer Awareness Event, we distributed a total of 1,954 maternity health supplies to 300 women. These supplies included 38 packs of maternity pads, 112 packs of sanitary pads, 124 packs of wipes, 144 packs of small diapers, and 16 large packs of diapers (each containing 96 diapers).

We detected one of the patient has breast cancer and a post-treatment evaluation is being followed up on the case.



We discovered Isabella had an open heart surgery for Truncus Artriosus which was attended to at Babcock University Teaching Hospital. We donated four hundred thousand naira (N400,000) for the surgery.



On January this year, we announced the opening of the Queen scholarship application. After we had screened the applications using our criterias, we choose the winners to be awarded. It was during the course the MICN launching conference event held on March 22nd that we awarded the 7 female students who won the scholarship. With this, we aim to empower and educate women in the health field through mentorship and professional development.


